The vast majority of history courses currently taught at MVC have been assessed. All SLOs in History 4,5,6,6H,7,7H,14,15,21,22, & 34 have been fully assessed. A number of SLOs have been assessed for History 1,2,12, & 26, but are incomplete as of this date (10/14/15). We are attempting to complete the assessment of these courses by the end of fall semester 2015. Currently, the only instructors teaching these courses are part-time history instructors.

There are a few courses that we currently do not teach, and have not taught, for several years at MVC. Therefore, they have not been assessed at all. These include History 8,9, 11&31. We have no intention of teaching History 8&9 and they should be removed from the MVC catalog. History 11 should be taught in the future and we have a part-time faculty member willing to teach it. History 12 has historically been taught in place of History 11 because it is a draw for students interested in contemporary military history - especially for our students who are veterans. MVC has not offered History 31 for several years, as it was cut when there were budgetary constraints within the District. The COR was recently updated with major modifications and it is an ideal time to add this course to our class offerings. We have a significant Latino student population who might find this course of interest and this course would increase the diversity of our history course offerings at MVC. If it is not offered in the near future, MVC should remove it from our catalog (though it will continue to be offered at Norco and City College). (Active)

 Success rates in history courses at MVC have remained relatively consistent over the past 10 years (2003-2014): ranging from a low of 65.8% (2012) to a high of 74.7% (2010). History course success rates fall into acceptable ranges when compared to overall college success rates. Success rates for all courses at MVC fall between 71.9% and 73.3%; history course success rates range from a low of 69.6% to a high of 75.9%. We will continue to monitor the numbers and work on improving the success rates for
